Dear Friends of CherYsh,

There is a child in **Doddakoppa** who now reads to her mother every evening. There is a young woman in **Tergaon** who, twelve months ago, had never opened a coding environment and who this year helped a classmate troubleshoot their first programme. There is a woman in **Mundwad** tracking her sugarcane nursery sales on a spreadsheet she built herself.

These moments did not make headlines. But they are precisely the kind of moments that tell us we are on the right path.

FY 2025–26 has been CherYsh's most expansive year to date. **Junior Shiksha** now operates across 40 villages - 14 of them brand new this year. **English Shiksha** reached 1,804 students, and Mohit Manage from Tergaon claimed the programme's inaugural Spell Bee title. **E-Shiksha** emerged from a challenging period with renewed clarity and commitment.

What holds all of it together is the same thing it has always been: **the women who teach**. Our Learning Facilitators grew up in the villages they now serve. Many were students in CherYsh classrooms before they became educators. Every morning they walk into a room full of children and quietly prove what becomes possible when talent is trusted.

To every person who believed in this work - thank you. The classrooms exist because of you. So do the children sitting in them.

### Junior Shiksha

For children in **Classes 1–4 across 40 villages in Haliyal Taluk and Dharwad**, Junior Shiksha is where the habit of learning takes root. Structured CFTE materials in Mathematics, English and Phonics carry children from Level 1 through Level 4 at a pace that builds genuine confidence. This year saw **14 new centres** open their doors - the largest single-year expansion in the programme's history.

### English Shiksha

Across **35 centres in Haliyal Taluk**, English Shiksha gave 1,804 students the language competency and life skills to move through the world with greater confidence. The phonics-first approach, anchored by the Deshpande Foundation's curriculum reached children who had never used English outside a classroom. **71.5%** of enrolled students are girls, reflecting the trust families place in a model built by women, for children, within their own villages.

### E-Shiksha

E-Shiksha ran **19 centres across Haliyal, Dharwad, and Kalghatagi**, reaching 326+ students with Scratch programming, LibreOffice, and practical digital literacy. Students didn't just learn to operate computers, they learned to build things with them. The Year-End Exhibition at Dharwad and Kalghatagi centres produced **five student projects** that left parents and school officials pledging higher enrolment.

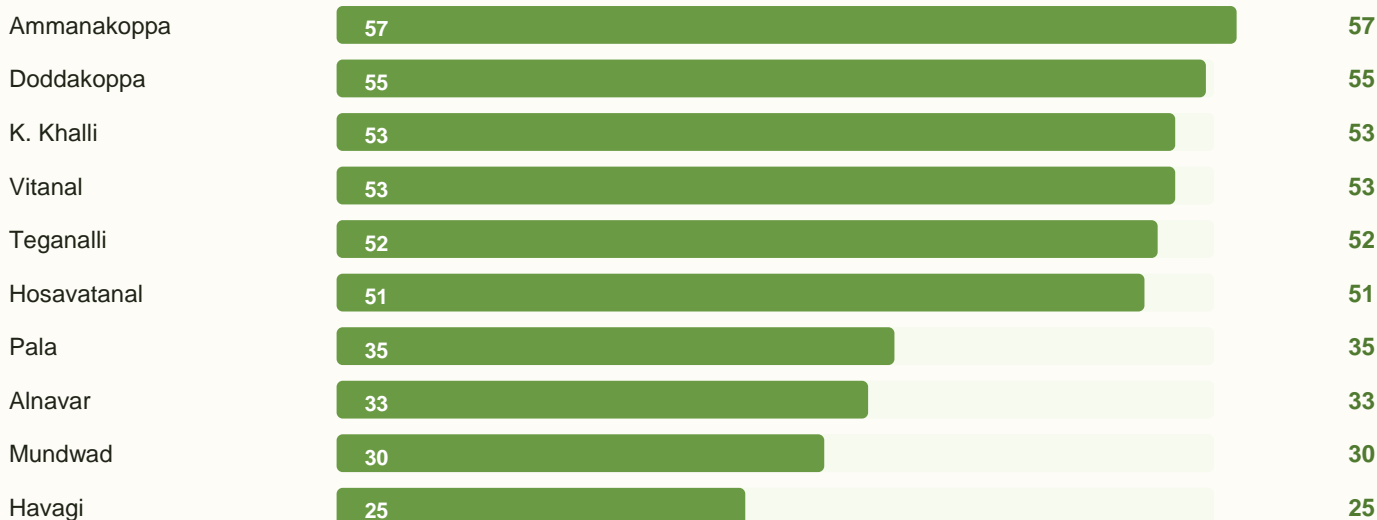

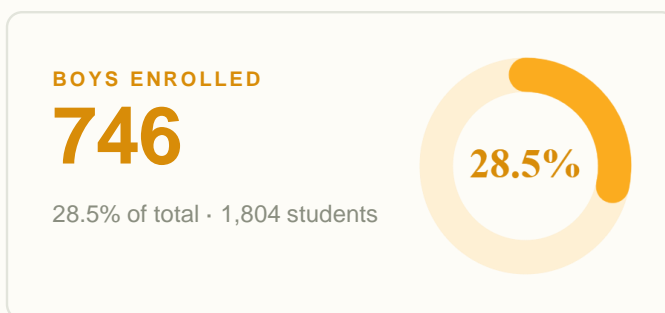
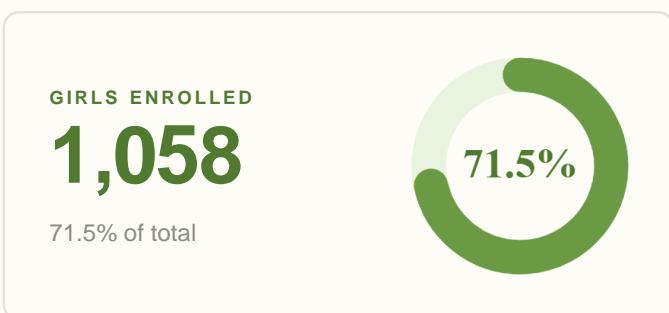
## ES English Shiksha — Top Centres by Enrolment

## G English Shiksha — Gender Split

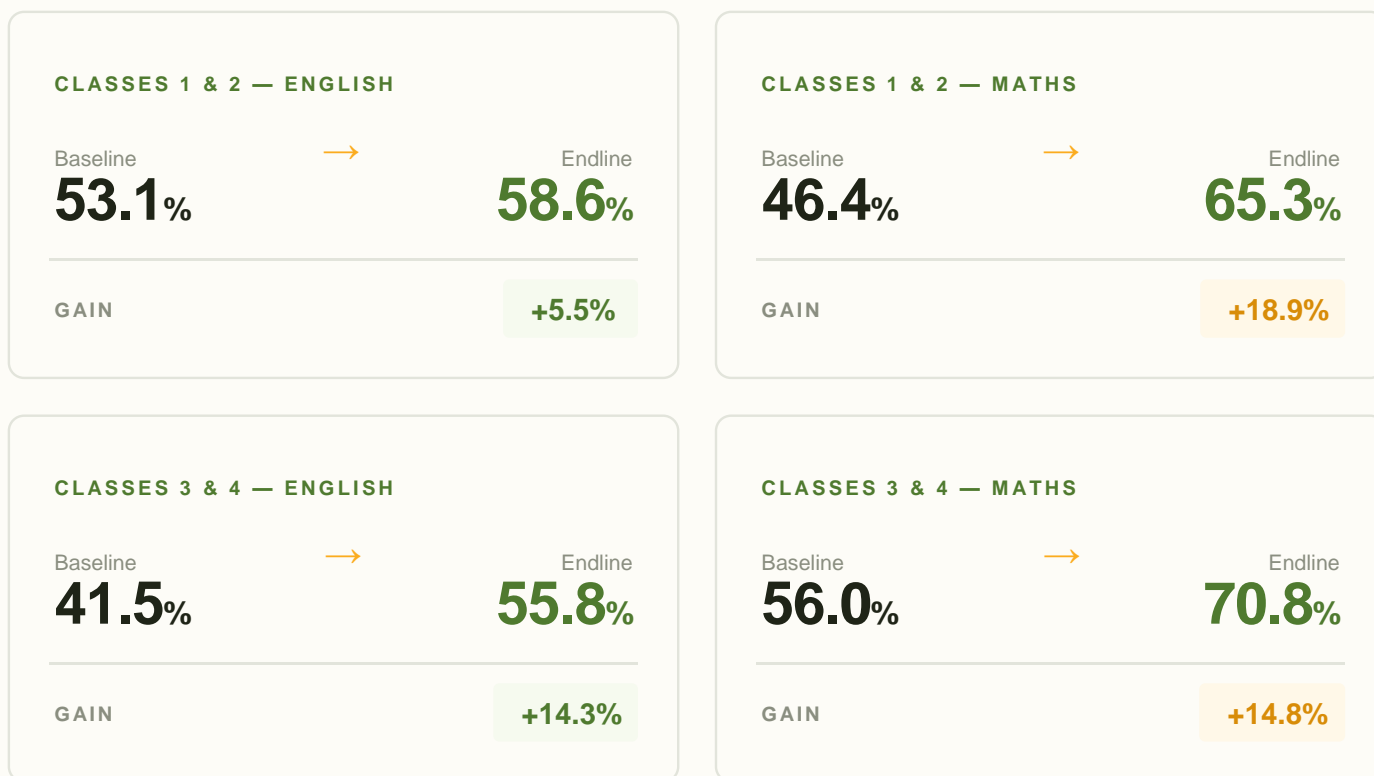

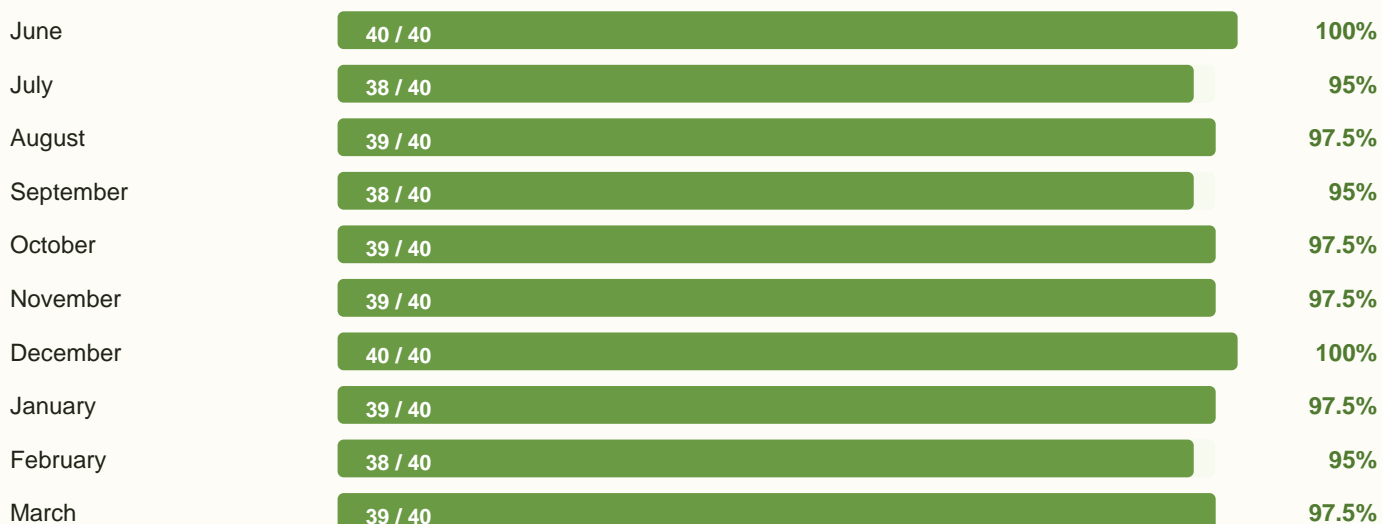

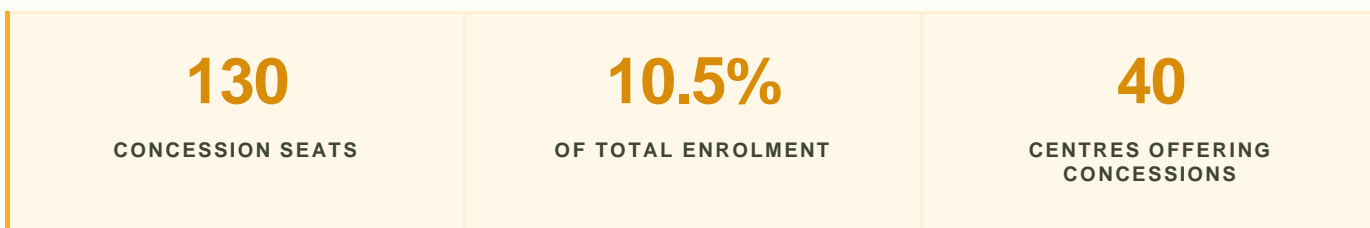

Students from Kannada-medium schools adjusting to English instruction.

Lack of electricity and suitable learning spaces in some villages.

Limited understanding of long-term value of continued education.

# The road ahead — FY 2026–27.

The combination of strong programme delivery, community trust, and honest reflection in 2025–26 gives CherYsh a clear foundation for the year ahead.

## Endline Analysis

Complete and publish endline assessment results for English Shiksha. Use findings to redesign curriculum focus areas — particularly phonics reinforcement for lower-performing centres.

## Community Expansion

Continue SDMC and panchayat partnerships. Expand community engagement to reach families who have not yet enrolled their children — with a continued focus on girl learners.

## Facilitator Quality

Deepen mentoring and introduce peer-observation frameworks. Begin the LF Certification pathway for E-Shiksha. Maintain high attendance and support facilitator wellbeing.

## E-Shiksha Rebuild

Restore E-Shiksha operations in Haliyal with strengthened financial governance protocols. Expand the Dharwad and Kalghatagi centres. Launch industrial visit programme.

## Junior Shiksha Growth

Consolidate the 14 new centres opened this year. Deepen CFTE curriculum implementation through Level 5. Train new cluster facilitators to support the expanded network.

## Technology Integration

Full Zoho implementation for programme MIS, donor CRM, and HR. Real-time dashboards for programme monitoring. Digital attendance and reporting across all 40 centres.

## STEM & AI Shiksha

Introducing hands-on technology education to rural youth . Built with KLE Tech University, students learn Python, AI fundamentals, Raspberry Pi and IoT in village learning centres that have never had access to this kind of teaching before. Delivered by trained local facilitators , many of them former CherYsh students. This creates a direct pipeline from rural classroom to digital career. Currently piloting in Doddaballapur, with Devanahalli & Dharwad next.

## People-first

CherYsh's commitment to the women who make everything else possible. In 2026–27, we formally structure Educator Training, Skilling & Livelihood, and Entrepreneurship as a single Empower pillar investing in the pipeline of women across Haliyal and Dharwad who teach in our centres, run our labs, and are now building livelihoods of their own..

### Facilitator Induction & Monthly Training

15 induction sessions held across Junior, English & E-Shiksha programs. Monthly 2-day skill training run for 11 consecutive months, covering teaching skills, classroom management, communication and digital methods.



### Livelihood Training — RESTI Support

12 women enrolled in a 30-day livelihood training programme, beauty parlour skills, tailoring and entrepreneurship development supported by RESTI.



### Market Exhibitions

Women from quilt and shawl groups participated in public exhibitions to showcase handmade products and gain direct market exposure — building confidence and buyer connections.

### Women's Capacity-Building Camp

4-day residential training at Chatrapati Shivaji School for 100+ women. Covered leadership, communication, entrepreneurship, confidence building and livelihood opportunities. Guided by resource persons from Deshpande Foundation, CDPO & Education Dept.



### KLE University Partnerships

Fashion Design students visited quilt & shawl groups in Tattigera and Mangalwad to understand rural entrepreneurship. MBA students conducted sessions on marketing linkage, branding and online marketing for livelihood groups.

### International Women's Day

Celebrated with women leaders and community members. Participants engaged in sessions on empowerment, leadership, networking, confidence building and social participation.
